Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to candidates with experience in strategic planning and strategic management in global organizations. Preference will be given to candidates with experience teaching doctoral coursework and supervising dissertation research. Evidence of excellence in teaching and other scholarly endeavors is particularly valued as is a demonstrated ability to work effectively with colleagues and others in a collaborative, constructive manner. Prior work experience in strategy development, strategic planning, and strategic management in a global context is also highly desirable.
